CHP Position on the “Hands-Free” Wireless Telephone Laws

Can we use our radios after the “hands-free” law goes into effect?

CGC has been flooded with opinions on the subject of the “hands-free” wireless telephone laws that go into effect in California on July 1, 2008. However, two readers sent us copies of the following letter from the California Highway Patrol (CHP) that appears to be great news for not just ham radio operators, but two-way users in general.

CGC has verified the authenticity of the following e-mail. Please, no more letters on “hands-free” unless you have breaking news from official sources. We greatly appreciate your input but do not have the staff to

summarize all of the views, many from individuals who have not yet seen the CHP letter.

While the following letter is not necessarily binding on non-CHP law enforcement officers, we plan to carry a copy of the letter in our two-way radio equipped vehicles to reduce our chances of becoming a legal test case come July 1.

The new cell phone laws involve only wireless telephones. They do not concern radios such as your (Amateur Radios), unless they are also wireless telephones. Again, the law only applies to wireless telephones. Thanks for your inquiry. If you have any further questions, please give us a call. Or, you can

MDARC Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

May 5, 2008

Fuddruckers, 1940 N. Main St., Walnut Creek

President Jason Legate W6SN, called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m.

Other Board Members present: Vice-President Dave Mulkearns, K6OH; Secretary Paul Dickey, N6JOX; Treasurer Don Anthony, N6SIA (in part); and EC Bob Green, K6GD. Also present were Directors Herbert Cole, KI6ATB; Dave Gordon, N6SWE; Trevor Hall, WA6JAU; and Trevor Raty, KG6MDW; as well as Past President Marty Heyman, W6MDH. Also present were Tim Barrett, K6BIV, as well as OH and MDW XYLs.

The minutes of the last meeting were approved as published.

Treasurer Don Anthony reported \$43,652.13 in CDs, and a \$8,778.34 checkbook balance. Also, Don reported that insurance coverage was denied for certain equipment, including the laminator and projectors. Jason will check further into this issue. Don turned over the refreshment and drawing equipment because he will have surgery and be unavailable at meetings for about 3 months. He will continue to pay the bills and track the club treasury.

SK announcement: Bill Mullen, KG6OBS, Concord.

The Board discussed some auction rules, such as: early check-in, equipment to stay on tables (no withdrawal, etc.). Next year's auction rules will be published in advance.

The Field Day site will be at Heather Farms Park in Walnut Creek. The agreement with the city has been approved.

Committee Reports:

Tech Committee:

Trevor Hall reported on the recent Saturday meeting and the discussion of ATV. The group plans to have ATV active, but the proposed freq. (s) in the 900 band have conflicts, and would not be available. The NARCC meeting on May 10 will be discussing frequency situations. The committee discussed ongoing interference on 2m, and further follow-up. They decided to reinstate the commute-time timer. The 1.2 Gig antenna replacement will be brought to the membership for a vote.

The Board conveyed to the Committee their sense that first priority now should be the completion of the 2m voter project. (The ATV antenna will be placed on the tower to ensure operation of ATV.) After the voter project, ATV or new projects could be addressed.

Old Business:

- Herb will check on getting flyers to HRO.

New Business:

- The Board agreed that a

“Sunshine” Coordinator should be named, perhaps on a monthly basis. Jason accepted an offer from Dave, K6OH, to volunteer for this month.

- The By-laws may need to be revised to raise the \$200 limit on Board only approval of expenditures, perhaps by indexing for inflation, with a periodic review.
- Tim K6BIV advised the Board that an initiative being discussed was the narrow-banding of 2m (not D-Star). NBFM would have splits at 12.5kc, which would require a new frequency allocation of repeaters. The Board discussed this idea, and offered a sense of support.

Emergency Coordinator:

Bob noted that RACES changed their meeting date to the 4th Wednesday instead of the 1st Wednesday. Training remains on the 3rd Wednesday. Check the website at www.cc-races.org.

Jason adjourned the meeting at 8:45 p.m.

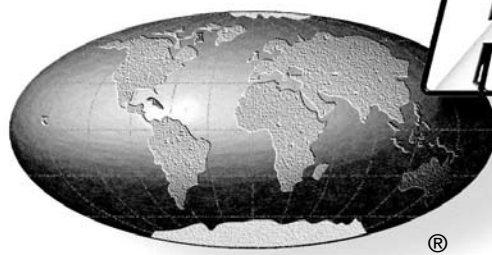

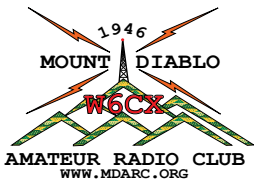
